#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION**

The purpose of the Code Enforcement Division (Division) is to help improve our neighborhoods and economic conditions. The Division is responsible for the enforcement of the following ordinances in the Vallejo Municipal Code:

- Property Maintenance Ordinance
- Vacant Building Ordinance (Residential Property Registration)
- <u>Vehicle Abatement Ordinance</u> (on PRIVATE property)
- Abandoned Shopping Cart Prevention Ordinance

#### **Common Code Enforcement Violations**

Each year, the Code Enforcement Division responds to about 3,000 complaints pertaining to property maintenance and other related violations. The types of violations that are typically reported and inspected include:

- Junk, trash & debris on private properties
- Deteriorated exteriors such as roofs, fences, and sidings
- Unsecured and abandoned swimming pools
- Vehicles parked on lawns, inoperable/unregistered vehicles parked on private property
- Trash bins blocking the sidewalk, strewn in the yard, placed on the sidewalk/street or driveway, too early or left out after 8:00 p.m. on service day
- Graffiti on private properties
- Weeds & overgrown vegetation on developed properties
- Vacant buildings
- Abandoned shopping carts
- Inhabited trailers, illegal vehicle repair business



Visit the downtown Vallejo Farmer's Market to celebrate Earth Day on Saturday, April 16 from 9 am to 1 pm. It's fun and free! There will be music, face painting, jugglers, and great information on less toxic approaches to controlling garden pests, water conservation and so much more! The Vallejo Watershed Alliance will also be there with creek critters from Lake Chabot.



#### Free Thermometer Exchange at Earth Day Event!

Bring your old mercury thermometer to the Vallejo Sanitation and Flood Control Booth at the Farmer's Market and receive a free digital thermometer in exchange. Since mercury is a toxic substance that can harm humans and wildlife, exchanging your mercury thermometer will ensure it doesn't wind up in the landfill or harm the environment.

#### **Recycled Sculpture and Artwork Contest**

In honor of Earth Day 2016, the City of Vallejo's Public Works Department is hosting the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Recycled Sculpture and Artwork Contest. All prizes will be awarded at Vallejo's Earth Day event at the Farmer's Market on Georgia Street and Marin Street. Various pieces of the recycled art will be displayed in the lobby of City Hall from April 11 through April 22, 2016. It is always fun, and amazing, to see the clever and creative sculptures and artwork made from aluminum cans, plastic bags, and junk of all kinds, that would otherwise wind up in the landfill.

#### **EARTH DAY NETWORK**

The theme for Earth Day 2016 is Trees for the Earth! Our planet is currently losing over 15 billion trees each year due to deforestation, land development, and bad forest management (that is roughly 48 football fields every minute). Trees for the Earth (#Trees4Earth), is a plan to plant 7.8 billion trees by Earth Day's 50th anniversary n 2020. That is one tree for every person on the planet!

Trees for the Earth will focus on those regions of the world most affected by deforestation. In order to achieve the goal of planting 7.8 billion trees, the Earth Day Network (EDN) will work with partners from all levels of society, integrate trees into existing campaigns, and create coalitions with advocates all across the globe.

The goals for planting trees are as simple as they are important:

- Fight climate change and pollution
- Support communities, their local economies, and their way of life
- Protect biodiversity
